



c. From 4:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., 28 April 1961 there will be a nation-wide CONELRAD program during which all radio and TV stations not operating under CONELRAD will be off the air. The CONELRAD programs will be devoted to Civil Defense. CONELRAD may be dialed at 640 and 1240, A. M. Radio.

d. It is urged that local directors ensure that this material is prominently utilized for evening papers on 27 April and morning papers on 28 April and in weekly papers, to inform the public as to the meaning of the signal and avoid any public alarm.

e. This bulletin is being sent direct to all Fire Chiefs and Police Chiefs in Massachusetts, and to the State Civil Defense organizations in adjacent states, for their information.

5. Reporting -

a. Responsible authorities in each city and town should submit report to their Area Director as soon as possible after sounding the "Take Cover" signal, on the following points:

- (1) Time received "Take Cover" signal and source of warning.
- (2) Time local "Take Cover" signal sounded.
